Project Background

Captus Generation is an Alberta company with a vision for sustainable energy development on industrial land south of Pincher Creek.

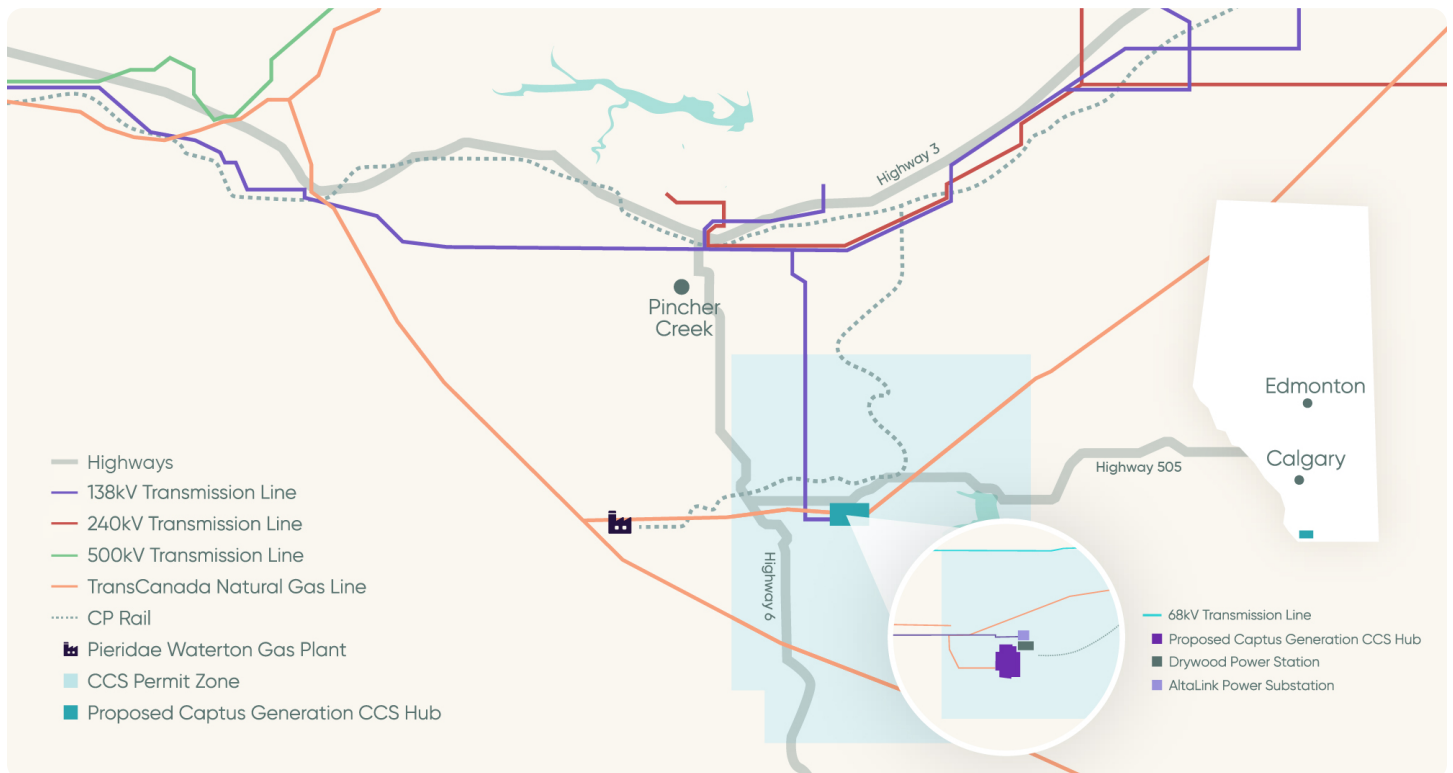
We are pursuing an opportunity to leverage existing infrastructure and assets in the Pincher Creek region to develop a climate-friendly power hub. Our long-term vision is to build reliable natural gas-fired electricity generation on an existing industrial site, while repurposing the region's depleted oil and gas reservoir to permanently store the associated carbon emissions underground.

With everything needed to generate clean electricity and to sequester emissions in the immediate vicinity, Captus

has significant cost, timing and grid advantages over other electricity projects that propose to use carbon capture and storage (CCS). We believe this is a significant opportunity for the Pincher Creek region, which will bring skilled jobs, investment, income and tax revenue to the area.

In the spring of 2024, we introduced Captus to our neighbours, the community of Pincher Creek and surrounding areas.

This engagement summary provides an overview of our activities to date, with more to come as our plans progress.

Community Information Session

On Thursday, May 23, 2024, we held a well-attended information session from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Twin Butte Community Hall. We were pleased to have 34 people join us to learn about the vision and early plans for Captus. Two of our senior leaders, Paul Connolly and Mark Taylor, along with our Community Relations Manager Tamille Beynon, delivered a presentation and responded to questions and comments for more than two hours. Five people submitted written comment forms, which we provided at the event.

While we are still in the planning stages of Captus, we felt it was important to introduce ourselves early and start building relationships with our future neighbours. All questions and comments were noted, and we look forward to our next event when we have more detailed information to share.

Next Steps

The Captus team is working on several fronts, including having discussions with regulators, governments and potential commercial partners. We hope to reach a final investment decision (FID) in early 2025.
